The National Strategy for the Creation of The Department of Homeland Security

- No one single government agency had homeland security as its primary mission
- Responsibilities for homeland security were dispersed among more than 100 different government organizations
- America needed a single, unified homeland security structure to improve protection against today's threats and be flexible enough to help meet the unknown threats of the future.

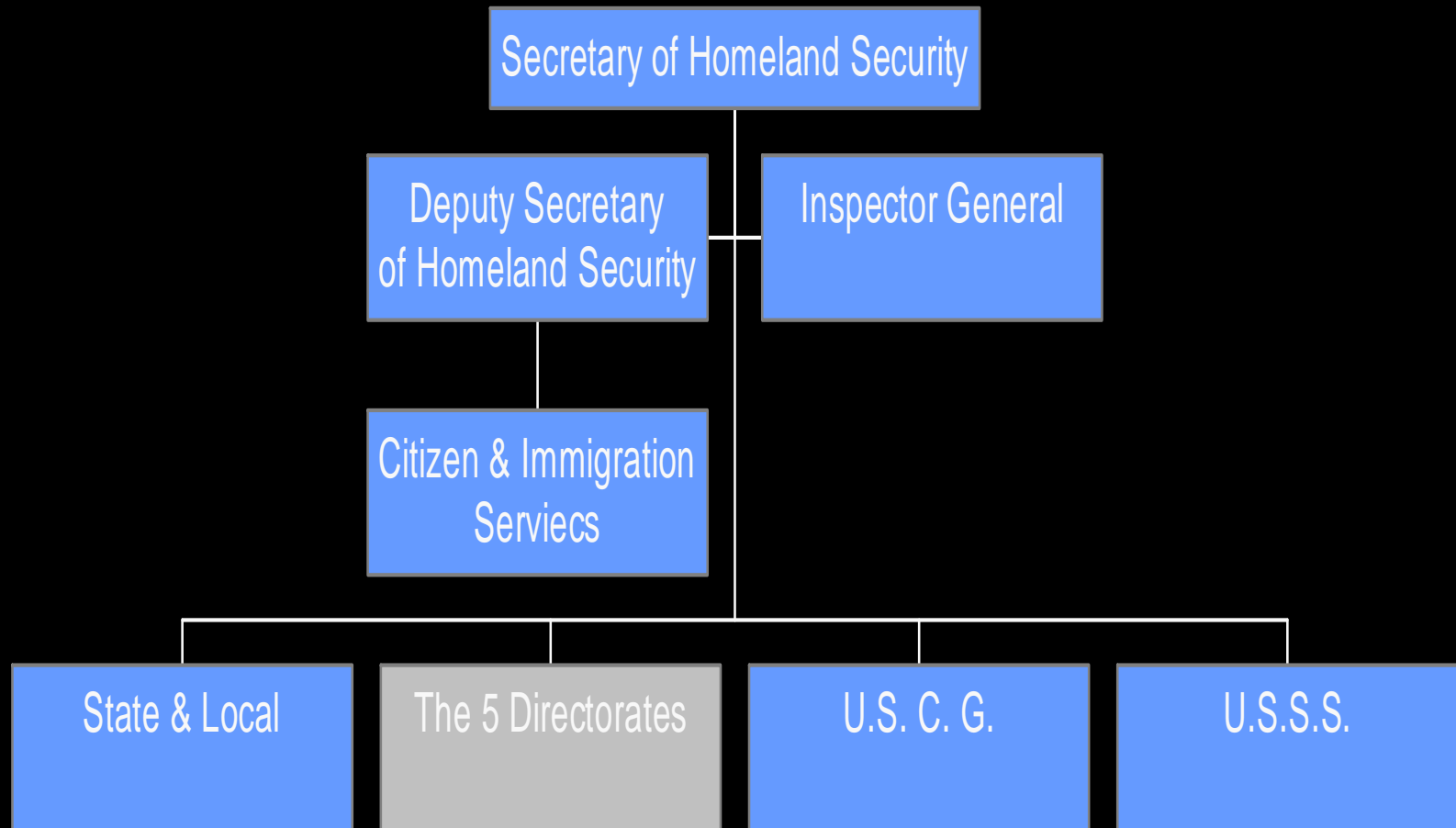

Customs and Immigration Services

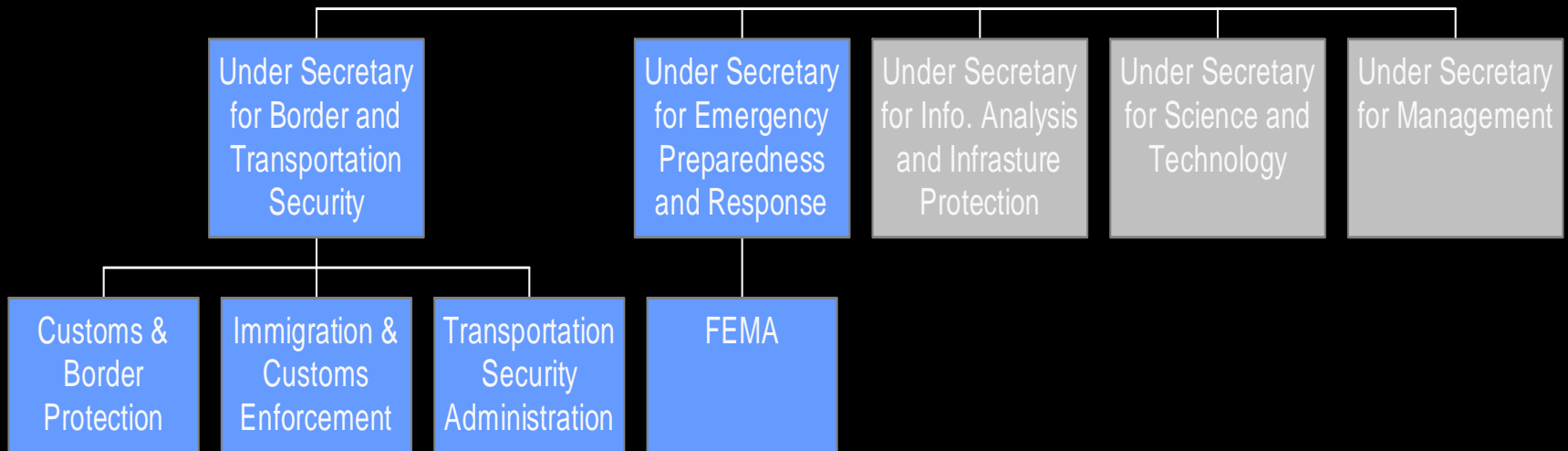
Annually

- Process and adjudicate over 6 million applications;
- Serve over 14 million customers via the National Customer Service Call Centers;
- Serve over 5 million customers through information counters at local offices;
- Serve over 3 million customers by phone through contacts at the Service Centers;
- Process approximately 90,000 asylum cases; and
- Perform approximately 100,000 refugee interviews.

The Five Directorates



Science and Technology



- This Directorate will seek to utilize all scientific and technological advantages when securing the homeland.
- Research and develop processes and equipment for preparing for and responding to the full range of terrorist threats including weapons of mass destruction.

Information Analysis and Infrastructure Protection



- This Directorate merges the capability to identify and assess a broad range of intelligence information concerning threats to the homeland under one roof, issue timely warnings, and take appropriate preventive and protective action. This office will analyze intelligence and information from other agencies (including the CIA, FBI, DIA and NSA) involving threats to homeland security and evaluate vulnerabilities in the nation's infrastructure.

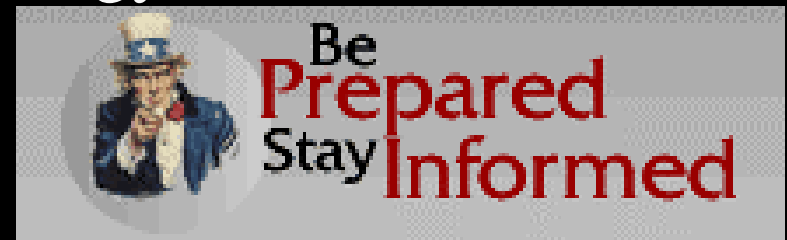
Management

- As the largest investigative arm of the Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) brings a unified and coordinated focus to the enforcement of federal immigration laws, customs laws, and, as of November 2003, air security laws. ICE works to protect the United States and its people by deterring, interdicting, and investigating threats arising from the movement of people and goods into and out of the United States; and by policing and securing federal government facilities across the nation.

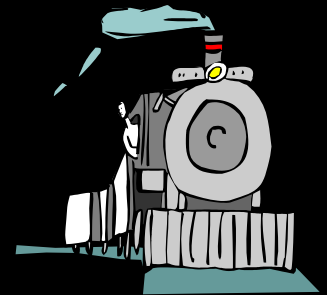
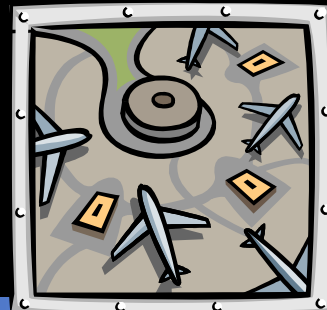
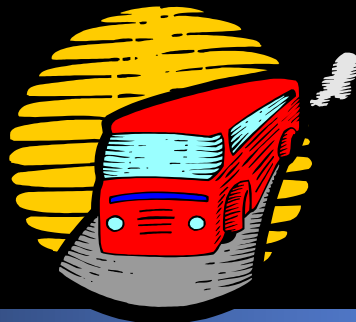

Transportation Security Administration

- Responsibility for security of all modes of transportation and directly employs airport security and law enforcement personnel. Tools it uses include intelligence, regulation, enforcement, inspection, and screening and education of carriers, passengers and shippers. TSA's core mandate is to ensure that the nation has a robust and efficient transportation infrastructure that keeps pace with modern technology and the nation's demographic and economic growth.

Building a New Agency

- 19 to 10 Financial Management Services
- 13 to 8 Contracting Offices
- 22 to 7 Human Resource Offices
- 8 to 3 Payroll Systems, soon 1
- 22 to 3 Property Management Systems
- 80 DHS Grant Programs
- \$2.4 B to First Responders
- 42 IT systems w/ security plans; 37 certified; 11 contingency plans

DHS 2004 Year-End Review

- 428 Million passengers & pedestrians processed at ports of entry. *(includes 262 Million aliens – 643,000 deemed inadmissible)*
- 1,169,148 illegal aliens arrested by Border Patrol agents & USCG at ports of entry
- Container Security Initiative expanded to 21 countries – totaling 33 foreign ports
- Integrated Automated Fingerprint System operational at all Border-Patrol stations – 23,000 with criminal record arrested

DHS 2004 Year-End Review (cont'd)

- Customs Trade Partnership Against Terror (C-TPAT) reaches 8,000 members
- 56,321 seizures of illegal drugs – almost 2.5 Million pounds
- Seized more than \$138 million worth of counterfeit goods
- Provided \$2.25 Billion in disaster aid

DHS 2004 Year-End Review (cont'd)

- Assisted more than 1.1 million hurricane victims
- Federal Law Enforcement Training Center trained 44,750 students
- 300 ICE agents assigned to Joint Terrorism Task Forces nationwide
- 2,500 criminal investigations for illegal exports of arms, technology and WMD

DHS 2004 Year-End Review (cont'd)

- 895 indictments for financial crimes
- 4,600 child sex predators apprehended with 2,100 of them deported
- 150,000 aliens removed – 53% were criminals
- 1,307 responses to bomb threats & suspicious packages in Federal facilities

DHS 2004 Year-End Review (cont'd)

- 6,501,193 prohibited items collected at airports with 3,000 arrests at security check points
- 650 million passengers, 1.8 million/day – average wait time under 12 minutes
- 500,000 new citizens naturalized – includes 9,000 military expedited processing
- 35 million applicant background checks

DHS 2004 Year-End Review (cont'd)

- Assisted U.S. Families with the adoption of 20,000 children from other countries
- 5,498 lives saved and 30,895 maritime search and rescues conducted
- Implemented the Maritime Transportation Security Act
- Operation Firewall resulted in preventing \$1 Billion in global cyber organized crime fraud

DHS 2004 Year-End Review (cont'd)

- Completed 13,395 criminal investigations, which resulted in the seizure of 499 counterfeit production plants and \$46.5 Million in counterfeit currency
- US-VISIT implemented in 115 airports and 14 seaports.
- Visa Waiver Program processed 14 million travelers
